Meeting people	Attack	L	Always ask for identification.  Make sure someone knows where you are and who you are meeting.  Always carry a mobile phone.	
Manual Handling	Slips, back injury	L	Avoid lifting heavy objects. Seek help or use lifting aids.  If unavoidable, ensure the environment is safe, with no tripping hazards.	
Working at height	Slips strains and fractures	L	Do not work at above-head height when alone.	

Fire	Burns, smoke inhalation, fatal injury	L	Be familiar with fire evacuation procedures.	Fire extinguisher for the office
			Ensure main door keys are always easily accessible.	
			Do not attempt to fight the fire. Leave the building.
